3	Good morning and welcome. My name
4	is Justin Bland. I am the Director of
5	Commercial Waste for the New York City
6	Department of Sanitation. Thank you for
7	attending this public hearing this
8	morning.
9	DSNY is conducting this remote
10	hearing in accordance with the
11	requirements of the City Administrative
12	Procedure Act. The purpose of this
13	hearing is to receive comments from the
14	public on the Department's proposed rule
15	to establish requirements for carters
16	operating in commercial waste zones.
17	This proposed rule was published in
18	the City Record on December 18, 2020.
19	DSNY emailed copies of the rule to all
20	New York City local elected officials,
21	the City's fifty-nine community boards,
22	media and interested parties and
23	published the proposed rule on our
24	website.
25	Each year in New York City, more

2	than 100,000 commercial establishments
3	generate more than 3 million tons of
4	refuse and recyclables. Approximately 90
5	private carters collect this waste from
6	commercial establishments across the
7	City.
8	The current system for collecting
9	commercial waste from the City's
10	businesses has resulted in millions of
11	excess truck miles driven every year
12	that harm the City's air quality,
13	increase greenhouse gas emissions,
14	create noise pollution and negatively
15	impact public health. Additionally, the
16	industry has lacked strong customer
17	service standards, and pricing has
18	remained unclear and confusing to most
19	customers, putting small businesses at a
20	significant disadvantage.
21	In response to these documented
22	problems, the Department released a
23	comprehensive plan for reforming the
24	private carting industry in November
25	2018, after years of extensive public
l

2	outreach and engagement with a wide
3	variety of stakeholders. On November 20,
4	2019, Local Law number 199 for the year
5	2019 was enacted, which authorizes the
6	Department to create a commercial waste
7	zones system, and on February 14, 2020,
8	the Department published final rules
9	creating the 20 commercial waste zones.
10	Citywide, the adoption of the
11	commercial waste zones system will
12	dramatically reduce truck traffic
13	associated with this industry by more
14	than 50 percent. This system will
15	improve the quality of life of all New
16	Yorkers, serve the needs of the City's
17	local businesses, and support the City's
18	short and long-term goals for a cleaner,
19	safer, and more sustainable city.
20	The Department will use a
21	competitive procurement process to
22	select up to three private carters to
23	service businesses within each
24	commercial waste zone. The competitive
25	solicitation process will also be used

2	to select up to five carters to provide
3	containerized commercial waste
4	collection services citywide. This
5	process will identify the carters that
6	can provide high quality service at low
7	prices. The resulting contracts will
8	include standards for pricing, customer
9	service, safety, environmental health,
10	and requirements to promote the City's
11	commitment to recycling and
12	sustainability. The Request for
13	Proposals (RFP) will be issued in two
14	parts. Part 1 was issued on November 19,
15	2020, with responses due on February 19,
16	2021. Part 2 will be issued in the
17	coming months.
18	In this rulemaking, the Department
19	is establishing requirements for carters
20	selected to operate under the commercial
21	waste zones program. Specifically, these
22	proposed rules include provisions
23	addressing:
24	Definitions.
25	Customer service requirements.

6	This proposed rulemaking also makes
7	conforming amendments to the existing
8	requirements for commercial
9	establishments related to recycling and
10	source separated organics to recognize
11	the commercial waste zones program.
12	The Department is seeking comments
13	on the entirety of this rule and will
14	review and consider all public comments
15	received. In order to facilitate the
16	success of this novel program, the
17	Department particularly invites comment
18	from the commercial waste industry,
19	their customers and the general public
20	on the following topics:
21	Fees allowed to be charged in §
22	20-21(c)(2); The process for rate
23	adjustments in § 20-21(d); Minimum
24	services levels in § 20-22(a)(2);
25	Reasons for non-collection in §

2	20-23(a); Customer service plan minimum
3	requirements in § 20-25(b); and Delivery
4	of organic waste for other uses
5	described in § 20-32(d).
6	These new proposed rule requirements
7	will take effect in each zone when the
8	commercial waste zones system is
9	introduced in that particular zone,
10	according to the implementation schedule
11	that the Department will publish in a
12	future rulemaking.
13	Please note that while some of these
14	proposed requirements for commercial
15	waste carters are similar to existing
16	Business Integrity Commission (BIC)
17	requirements for trade waste licensees,
18	many of the requirements have changed to
19	meet the standards set out in Local Law
20	199.
21	The requirements in BIC's rules for
22	trade waste licensees will continue to
23	apply until the transition of the
24	commercial waste zones program occurs in
25	each zone, in accordance with the

2	schedule and further details to be
3	provided in an upcoming DSNY rule.
4	Further details on the transition to
5	commercial waste zones will be provided
6	in a forthcoming rulemaking regarding
7	the transition start and end dates.
8	After the transition to commercial
9	waste zones occurs, BIC's requirements
10	regarding the topics contained in these
11	rules will not apply to commercial waste
12	carters, but will continue to apply to
13	licensees and registrants that are
14	hauling forms of trade waste other than
15	commercial waste, such as construction
16	and demolition debris. More details
17	regarding the applicability of BIC rules
18	to the commercial waste zones program
19	will be provided in future rulemakings.
20	Additional requirements for
21	commercial waste zone carters will also
22	be proposed in a future rulemaking. The
23	Department anticipates that these
24	forthcoming rules will be introduced in
25	early spring, prior to the release date

1	Proceeding
2	of Part II of the RFP. It is anticipated
3	that these forthcoming rules will
4	address safety requirements, third party
5	waste audits, fees, reporting, and
6	recordkeeping requirements.
7	A court reporter is present today
8	and will record the hearing. You may
9	present an oral statement or submit
10	written comments concerning either or
11	both of the proposed rules. We have
12	been accepting written comments on the
13	proposed rules since their publication.
14	Please note that the deadline for
15	submission of written comments has been
16	extended to February 9, 2021. Such
17	comments may be mailed or faxed to the
18	addresses in the notice of proposed
19	rulemaking, submitted to DSNY through
20	the NYC rules website, or emailed
21	directly to nycrules@dsny.nyc.gov.
22	DSNY will make available a copy of
23	all written comments received on or
24	before February 9, 2021, together with a
25	transcript of today's hearing, for

11	first and protective equipment PPE for
12	the first time because of COVID. We have
13	been blowing the wise isle in our
14	industry for years. And non union
15	sanitation countries never gave us
16	gloves, safety vest, when COVID hit we
17	didn't have the ability. I got COVID-19
18	in March and I had to Quertine away from
19	my fiance and son. I didn't feel the
20	same for weeks.
21	And it even when I was better I was
22	afraid to go back to work. Even since
23	the West commercial waste zones the
24	private carting owners this is unfair
25	and bad for for business. Most of these

19	large. In the five years proceeding of
20	Local Law 199 more than one dozen were
21	killed, and by reducing the number by
22	more than 50%. The implementation were
23	greatly reduced and the street users and
24	significantly reduce of the unsafe
25	driving and the greenhouse gas of the

3	having them in the and lastly the
4	greatest beneficiary should be the crews

15	impact of COVID that we had on our lives
16	and certainly on the businesses.
17	Since local 199 has been adapted the
18	world has changed Frankly in ways that
19	we don't understand and in many cases
20	permanently, and that is the assumption
21	for the zoning, it's now questionable.
22	The three year old data is now abselte.
23	Phase two may come out prematurely and
24	before that the City really understands
25	how many customers are in each zone.

3	it's difficult to determine when that
4	date will happen and the (opens
5	curtain.) Rises on Broadway, but I can
6	tell you without question we lost many
7	many customers. I would like to point
8	out that on December 17 they analyze
9	three million times by 100,000 estimated
10	existing customers. You self pointed out
11	Justin that the hard work the department
12	put in in reaching the steak hold and
13	getting the facts right.
14	And later Intix call memorandum
15	number 2, it states Local Law meaning
16	199 take into consideration the number
17	of customers in the average ton age of
18	waste, and that is a good policy we
19	created that. And the same zones are
20	designed grouping together the number
21	of customers in each community to create
22	20 zones that are generally comparable
23	in the amount of customer size and
24	tonage.
25	And right now today we don't know

3	respond, it's nearly impossible.
4	With regard to our own company.
5	Revenue is down 40 percent.
6	When the second wave hit in the
7	winter, where it started to come up a
8	little bit. It's still down 25 percent.
9	And I'm sorry it had to report that were
10	losing one hundred locations per week
11	that are closing temporary and the
12	magazines the office capacity has been
13	eleven percent right now. As we know all
14	companies throughout the City and the
15	questioning of whether or not employees
16	will return or how. International of
17	travel and it's impossible to predict
18	and certainly everyone on the call the
19	ending of this year and beginning of
20	next year.
21	And could want New York out. And New
22	York City will come back. We're
23	positive. I hope that everyone is.
24	But we need another environmental

20	today because next our customers and
21	businesses were the most highly impacted
22	by the regulations and we thank the
23	department for extending the formal and
24	written deadline that we did the request
25	to do. We don't mind additional time and

11	have. And in general the regulations as
12	they are proposed. And there unworkable
13	or costly burden some to all without any
14	material benefit. We proposed the
15	regulations are to be well unintended
16	there attempt to regulate something that
17	is something in New York City we believe
18	that they have major shortcomings and we
19	offer a couple of examples for today.
20	In section 2020 in regarding service
21	to customers part A it says the zone
22	awardees should go to contract with
23	there customers. And as you heard
24	testimony today, those who have
25	advocated for the law. Those who are out

5	So the regulations imposed a
6	requirement on the waste service company
7	or the zone of boardees rather, if we

12	it's a specific percentage of the
13	customer base.
14	And so again, and another question
15	that we would have on section 2020 and
16	the service to customers.
17	Part C of this section seems to
18	layout a series to create the swim lane
19	and with the different zone award and
20	the five zone and one of the individual
21	zones and we can't comprehend this. With
22	have studied it and looked at it. And we
23	respectfully request the department
24	rewrite the section and the technical
25	guidance and the specific examples about

13	rate established by the department.
14	And so we have gotten through those
15	two things, the maximum rate, the
16	minimum rate. In section regarding rates
17	it talks about the proportionally lower
18	rates. We have all been involved with
19	sold waste policy for a long time. We
20	understand the intent here, they want
21	more of it than the other.
22	And so you're telling us it's a
23	carter or whole ing company for organ or
24	recycling and that may in fact cost more
25	than the trash. And you bundles the rate

3	This presents a lot of difficulties
4	for us.
5	And so what were asking for is again
6	are their specific guidance that the
7	department might issue what it means and
8	perhaps a formula or some other
9	mechanisms that we can use that to
10	justify this pricing structure. It de
11	the way it is in a market place.
12	Further in this section regarding
13	rates has to do with part D it provides
14	the eleven specific cases that we can
15	charge over age fees for or separate
16	fees. While unintended misses the mark,
17	you miss the issue with the recycling
18	and organ about the quality of the
19	material it's prescribed ing a ten
20	percent contamination rate.
21	If you take the material to organ
22	facility that load will be rejected. And
23	many recycling centers are rejecting
24	less contamination than that.
25	And we believe that this kind of
